RCMDD 2011: The figure of the king was found missing following the looting and vandalism that happened in the museum on January 28, 2011. The skiff with the feet attached, the right arm, the harpoon, and the bronze hoop that the king held in his left hand were found in the museum; the rest of the figure was missing. The figure was among the four objects that had been found in a bag in a subway station by an Egyptian citizen on 12/04/2011, and taken to the Ministry of State for Antiquities Affairs, then moved to the Egyptian Museum on the same day.
